## at the Gallery at Tempe Center for the Arts I will...

- 1** Visit the “Page to Screen” exhibition (through June 6) that explores books adapted for television and film such as “How the Grinch Stole Christmas” from Dr. Seuss, Winnie the Pooh by A.A. Milne and classic fairy tales including Snow White and Cinderella. Follow a simple list of questions that make me LOOK, LEARN, INTERPRET and COMPARE artworks.
- 2** LOOK at art in the Gallery (such as animation cels by Walt Disney Studios). What can I see? Look for facts about the artwork such as the materials used to make it, how it was made and the subject matter of the story.
- 3** LEARN about the book authors and film makers (such as artist and director Chuck Jones who animated “The Dot and the Line”). What else can I learn? Learn more facts by reading text panels or books in the Gallery that describe the original book, the time in which it was made and why it was important.
- 4** INTERPRET meaning (such as the historical significance of ranching and mining in the 1940 film “Arizona”). Think about different cultural points of view from the time period in which the book and/or film was made and what historians today may think about it.
- 5** COMPARE artworks and stories (such as the different versions of “Sleeping Beauty” from Charles Perrault 1697, Brother’s Grimm 1812 and Walt Disney 1959). Look at the art and read the books and text panels in the Gallery. Make decisions about which story speaks to a modern viewer and which version will stand the test of time.
